Pastor Henderson's Sabbatical: July through October 2022

One part of Pastor Maggi's "terms of call" is the provision for a sabbatical every four years of service. Because of the pandemic, Maggi delayed the sabbatical she should have been in 2020. She is very excited to begin it this summer. This will be a time of retreat, renewal, and revitalization. In preparation for her sabbatical, the session, the worship committee and Maggi have been planning and dreaming for the days ahead. The time will mean rest and renewal for Maggi and revitalization for the church too.

Maggi says, "During my last sabbatical, I was impressed how Old First discovered anew that they are the priesthood of all believers and that everyone one has a part to play." Deacons and elders will take the lead doing much of the care for our community and three local pastors will be on call for pastoral emergencies.

Maggi's last Sunday with us before her sabbatical is next Sunday, June 26. She will be back in the pulpit at Old First again on November 6.
