Today's Guest Preacher: Nancy Martin Vincent

Today we welcome the Reverend Nancy Martin Vincent, DMin, to our pulpit. Dr. Vincent is the synod executive of our synod, the Synod of the Pacific, based in Petaluma.

Before her call to mid-council work, Nancy specialized in transitional ministry leading churches from 80 to 800 members to increased health and vitality. Nancy was a classmate with our own Pastor Maggi graduating from Union Theological Seminary (today Union Presbyterian Seminary) in Richmond, Virginia. Nancy received her Doctor of Ministry in homiletics (preaching) from McCormick Seminary, a member of the Association of Chicago Theological Schools (ACTS).

Next Sunday our guest preacher will be the Reverend Leslie Veen, DMin. Dr. Veen is the Associate Dean for Academic and Student Affairs for Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, an ordained teaching elder (minister of word and sacrament) in the Presbyterian Church (USA), a member of the Committee on Ministry for the Presbytery of San Francisco, and a parish associate for Seventh Avenue Presbyterian Church in the Inner Sunset. Her doctor of ministry dissertation examined the Holy Trinity, *perichoresis* and the church as community.

Leslie has a deep desire to help people discern and follow God's calling for their lives and to deepen their connection with the Divine as they do so. Leslie has been a resident of San Francisco for over 25 years and loves finding new ways to appreciate the beauty and creativity of the area every day.
