in the name of Jesus. Amen.



Composed just this year, the hymn was learned and sung during worship at the 225th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) held in June and July of this year. The Mid-Kentucky Presbytery of the PC(USA) holds the copyright to both words and music, and has graciously granted permission to all agencies and congregations of the PC(USA) to use them in worship.

Today we will learn the tune and the English verses. We will save the Korean and Spanish verses for the future.

Today's Guest Preacher: Virstan Choy

Our guest preacher today is the Reverend Virstan Choy. Mr. Choy has been a minister of Word and Sacrament (teaching elder) in the Presbyterian Church (USA) since 1975.

Virstan is thankful to God for his initial introduction to Christ through the youth group leaders, the church school teachers as well as the pastors at the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown and at Cameron House, for the nurture provided by seminary instructors at Princeton and San Anselmo, for wisdom received from lay leaders in the first congregation he served as pastor, the Sacramento Chinese Community Church, for insights from colleagues throughout his service as Associate Executive Presbyter in the San Jose Presbytery and Co-General Presbyter in the San Francisco Presbytery, and for enriching collaborations with fellow faculty at San Francisco Theological Seminary and McCormick Theological Seminary. He also appreciates learning from the congregations, and denominational and ecumenical bodies which he has assisted as workshop leader and consultant—congregations like Old First and its 1996 "Postcards from the Edge" Retreat at Westminster Woods and its hosting of the 1999 National Presbyterian Urban Ministry Conference!

Virstan is also grateful to God for his spouse, Marina Lew, as they transition into retirement, enjoying sacred moments with family in international travel, at Broadway musicals, and supporting Cal Women's Gymnastics.

Next Sunday's Guest Preacher: Jeanne Choy Tate

Next Sunday our guest preacher will be Jeanne Choy Tate. Dr. Tate is an author, early childhood educator, multicultural curriculum developer, and lay pastor.

After eighteen years as members of the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown, Jeanne Choy Tate and Buddy Tate Choy (along with then baby Jamie) crossed over Nob Hill to become members of Old First. While a member of Old First, Jeannie became a Commissioned Pastor at Noe Valley Ministry, where she is now a member. Buddy has retained his Old First membership. After many years working in bilingual/bicultural childcare, Jeannie received a Ph.D. from the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley. She later published her thesis as a book, *Something Greater: Culture, Family and Community as Living Story.* Today she continues to work for racial justice in the West Bay Region of Presbytery.
