Ordination of Samual Lundquist, This Afternoon

Former Old First pastoral resident Samual Lundquist will be ordained a minister of word and sacrament by the Presbytery of San Francisco today, 3:00 pm, at St John's Presbyterian Church, 25 Lake Street at Arguello Boulevard in San Francisco. At the same time, Sam will also be installed as an associate pastor at St John's. Old First got to know Sam and his gifts, when he led worship, preached, served and enlivened Old First from 2019 to 2020.

Ballot Review with Betty Voris, October 16

Betty Packard Voris, chair of San Francisco's Ballot Simplification Committee, and member of Old First, will review the November 8 ballot propositions (San Francisco and California) with us on Sunday, October 16, from 2:00 to 4:00 pm via Zoom.

Among the important City proposition topics are: two conflicting affordable housing measures, two conflicting measures on vehicles on JFK Drive in Golden Gate Park and the Great Highway, continuing the Sales tax for Transportation projects, an additional parcel tax for City College, tax on keeping residential units vacant, and changing some City elections to be held in evennumbered years. The invitation (link) to the Zoom meeting is being sent in this morning's and next Sunday's Emails from Old First. You can also ask the church office to send you the invitation.

Next Sunday's Guest Preacher: Sarah Reyes Gibbs

Next Sunday our guest preacher will be the Reverend Sarah Reyes-Gibbs, DMin. Dr. Reyes-Gibbs has just finished a three-year transitional/interim position with New Bridges, Hayward, after retiring in 2017 from her first call lasting nineteen years with Bethel Community Church, San Leandro. Not embracing retirement well, she continues to serve as a consultant with churches focused on transformation and with other presbyteries addressing ethnic concerns.

Before ordained ministry, Sarah served the Stockton Unified School District as an elementary and high school teacher for eight years, as a coordinator for a Drug Free School Zone at Edison High School, Stockton, and before that as a legislative assistant with the California legislature twenty years.

In addition to raising four children, Sarah also earned a bachelor at the age of 40, received her Masters of Arts in Education with an emphasis on administration, received her Master of Divinity at age 50, and received her Doctor of Ministry with an emphasis on parish redevelopment at age 60. Pastor Sarah's perspective on life and faith is shaped by her trust in God and her experience as a Filipina-American, pastor, wife, mother of four, *lola* (Filipino for grandmother) of fifteen, and much more!
