Today's Confession

Today's confession was written by the Reverend Malcolm Macdougall of the Church of Scotland.

I Was There to Hear Your Borning Cry, Hymn 488

Both the words and music of today's closing hymn, "I Was There to Hear Your Borning Cry," were composed by Minnesota-based John Carl Ylvisaker (1937-2017) for a 1985 video series about baptism by a predecessor denomination of today's Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, an ecumenical partner of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

Though this hymn is now included in songbooks and hymnals around the world, Ylvisaker's use of popular music styles was not always well received in church circles. Old First's office administrator, Brad Peterson, remembers the older generation's debate around "Mr. Ylvisaker," who was his junior high school choral teacher, and how thrilled his classmates were to sing – what was in the 70s – new music.

Josie Iselin is a photographer, author, and designer of many books. Her last few have focused on the world of seaweeds and kelp. Her most recent book, *The Curious World of Seaweed* (Heyday Books, 2019) is the basis for a traveling exhibition of prints by the same name.

Iselin is the co-director of a collaborative known as Above/Below, working to bring the recognition afforded the forests on land to the kelp forests below the ocean's surface. Above/Below will be releasing a web-based, comprehensive, story compendium about bull kelp this fall.
