Thank You to Josie Iselin

This is the last week the banners by San Francisco artist Josie Iselin will hang in the church. Please take a moment to sign a thank you card for her. The card can be found in the narthex after worship and also later at coffee hour.

Iselin is the co-director of Above/Below, a collaborative working to bring the recognition afforded the forests on land to the kelp forests below the ocean's surface. The banners depict a kelp forest.

Help Make New Artwork for the Reredos, Today

The Worship Committee is creating new artwork for the reredos (wall behind the choir) to follow the kelp banners by Josie Iselin. Those banners inspired us to think about all the ways the oceans and aquatic life are featured in the biblical story.

This water theme will continue with a school of fish swimming across the reredos. Our fish will be varied and colorful, much like our congregation and our community of San Francisco. Why fish? Fisherfolk were the first people Jesus called as disciples. Jesus fed a multitude with just a few fish. Bodies of water were often the site of some of Jesus' greatest teaching and also places of rest and renewal for Jesus. Early Christians also adopted the fish as a symbol of their faith. The Greek word for fish is $IXOY\Sigma$ (ichthys) and forms an acronym for the phrase "Jesus Christ, God's Son, the Savior."

We will need your help with cutting out the fish. Come one, come all to coffee hour after worship today to cut out the fish! We'll have paper, scissors, and fish patterns ready for your use. We will enjoy fun and fellowship as we work together to create this art project.

This art project has inspired Pastor Maggi to preach a series of sermons this summer focusing on water and aquatic life and how these stories still bring us to places of learning today.
