


Potluck Lunch, February 18

New Book for 2024: *Atlas of the Heart* Starting February 4 and 5



A new book discussion begins in February. The book will be Brené Brown's *Atlas of the Heart: Mapping Meaningful Connections and Language of the Human Heart.* Beginning with February, we will meet once a month to discuss one chapter from the book until we've finished the whole book.

Each month you can choose between an in-person meeting and an on-line meeting. We'll hold the in-person meeting on the first Sunday of each month. We'll meet in the library after coffee hour – soup will be provided. We'll hold our first in-person meeting on Sunday, February 4.

We'll hold the on-line meeting on the first Monday of each month at 7 pm via Zoom. We'll hold our first on-line meeting on Monday, February 5.

We'll cover the same material at both meetings. Whether in-person or on-line, each meeting will last an hour. For February, we will discuss the introduction and the first chapter of the book: "Places We Go When Things are Uncertain or Too Much."
