Belhar Confession - Belydenis van Belhar

The Belhar Confession, originally written in Afrikaans, was a statement of faith adopted by the Dutch Reformed Mission Church in South Africa in 1986. The confession broke important ground in racial healing in South Africa by explicitly denouncing racial segregation as a sin leading to enmity and hatred, and by proclaiming that God's justice requires the church to stand in solidarity with the poor or oppressed. Since its first publication the confession has been adopted by many Reformed churches around the world including our own Presbyterian Church (USA), which included our Book of Confessions in 2016.
