MAGGI'S MUSINGS

The season of Advent, a time of reflection and preparation before Christmas, begins this year on November 30. If we look and listen to the secular calendar or store windows, we could easily think that Christmas is already upon us and that it has little to do with the birth of Jesus Christ. But we, as disciples of Jesus, work and live by a different calendar. We seek to walk in the way of Jesus – not just during this season – but 365 days a year.

The season of Advent is a gift for refocusing ourselves, for setting ourselves on the path towards Jesus anew. Indeed it is a challenge to keep Christ at the center of our lives and perhaps especially amid everything that takes place in December. Yet, let's see if Advent can be a gift to help us to seek simplicity in all things and nurture our inward faith for outward living.

We are invited to go into Advent with joy, to let go of anxiety and to take on a spiritual practice which embraces simplicity and the meaning of the season. Here are some ways to start:

- ♦ Commit to using the **Advent Calendar** called *Decluttering for Christmas*. (Advent calendars called "Decluttering for Christmas" available at church or can be mailed to you. Simply call the church office. A one dollar donation per calendar is appreciated.)
- Use the devotional at www.d365.org. The site is the work of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, the Presbyterian Mission Agency, and the Episcopal Church. It is written primarily for youth and young adults, but I think is great for all ages.
- ◆ Look at the **Bible readings** for this month. (See the table on the last page of *Shared Life*.) Read the scriptures for each Sunday during the prior week. Let the scriptures work on you and in you during the week. You'll hear them woven into worship on Sunday and experience them differently, more deeply than you might have.
- Take the bulletin home and pray for those listed in the **prayers of the people** each week.
- ♦ Check out our **Facebook** page and see what poems or insight on Advent which I will put up during Advent.

Frankly, I need the focus of Advent this year. I will be praying for you, and I hope you will be praying for me, as we all seek to develop a life-giving, life-clarifying spiritual practice this year. I will leave you with a poem by the pastor and poet Ruth Burgess who often points me in the right direction.

FAREWELL FROM RICHARD BENEFIELD, DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

In the play, which became a motion picture, *Amadeus*, the composer Antonio Salieri wonders whether God is laughing maliciously at him through the Mozart's music. In Peter Gay's brief, award-winning book about Mozart, he states something to the effect... "when Mozart plays God is laughing." Both remarks point to the fact that for some, if not many, great music has a profound ability to move and influence us. There are many, like myself, who have had such experiences, where great pieces of music well-performed have moved us in otherwise unexplainable ways. Is that God speaking through the music?

It has been my honor, privilege, and pleasure to serve Old First Presbyterian Church as interim organist, interim organist-choir director, and, ultimately, Director of Music. I feel I have been a part of this community since my arrival in San Francisco in 2008, when I was given practice privileges on the organ, was the occasional substitute organist, and played a full-length organ recital for Old First Concerts. The most memorable experiences that I will take with me, however, are those involving performances of great pieces of music by our wonderful, dedicated choir. Highlights include Randall Thompson's *Alleluia*, portion of Handel's *Messiah* performed through the Sundays in Lent, and extra-special music on Christmas Eve and Easter Sunday. On a recent Sunday, during a sublime performance of William Byrd's *Agnus Dei* from the Mass for Four Voices, it was as though the congregation were breathing and singing with the choir on every note. At the conclusion of the piece, there was absolute silence. Was God speaking to us through that great music? –Richard Benefield

CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING, DECEMBER 21

Each year, Presbyterians bring our Christmas Joy Offering, to give thanks, and critically-needed support, to eligible PC(USA) active and retired church workers and their families who are struggling with urgent financial needs and income and housing supplements to qualifying retired church workers and their families. The offering also provides grants for clergy vocational training. This offering is a wonderful opportunity for caring Presbyterians who have been blessed with the means to express their generosity and support important needs in the PC(USA) community.

Last year, this assistance program gave 1,324 grants totaling \$5.6 million to Presbyterian Church servants and their families. This program receives half of the Christmas Joy Offering.

The offering also gives vital financial aid that enables deserving students to attend Presbyterian-related racial and ethnic colleges and schools. These institutions, such as Stillman College, a four-year, liberal arts school in Tuscaloosa, AL, have provided quality education to people who have contributed immeasurably to the church at large and the world. Many of the students are the first in their family to attend college and come from low-to-moderate income families.

THE COLUMBARIUM SOCIETY: COLUMBARIUM UPDATE

The Columbarium Society of Old First Presbyterian Church, made up of all those who hold niches or plaques in the Columbarium, meets periodically, and its members are eligible to serve on the Columbarium Ministry Team of Old First. The society held its annual meeting this year on Sunday, October 26, in the church Library.

At the meeting, the Columbarium Ministry Team reported that in 2014 a plaque in memory of former Old First member John Wilber was inscribed and installed, as was a plaque for Shirley Buono, dedicated in her memory by Presbyterian Women. Also this year, Old First member Linda Reyder and her brother purchased niches for their parents, and the ashes of their father, Howard Reyder, were committed there in a private ceremony in October. A double stone, now inscribed for Howard Reyder, covers these two niches. The day after the meeting took place, our church suffered the loss of Pam Byers. Her ashes, too, will repose in the Columbarium.

The Columbarium Fund continues to repay the amount owed to the church for final construction costs. We were able to repay \$4,000 this year, leaving a modest balance and moving us close to retiring this debt.

There are many reasons to choose the Old First Columbarium, some of which were shared among the attendees at the October 26 meeting: that it is a beautiful space; that as San Franciscans many of us are far from our roots and from the family cemetery plot; that we may have no family left in the place we came from; that we are longtime members of this church and may have marked major life events here, such as a marriage; that our mortal remains will rest near those of people who were our friends.
