MAGGI'S MUSINGS

The echoes of *Allelnias* and *He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed* are still echoing my ears and heart from Easter Sunday worship. I find myself thankful that we are an Easter people not just one Sunday a year but 365 days a year. During the new officers training we studied the Brief Statement of Faith (see pcusa.org for a copy and history) and I found it gave structure and words to much I am experiencing and contemplating this Eastertide:

In gratitude to God, empowered by the Spirit, we strive to serve Christ in our daily tasks and to live holy and joyful lives, even as we watch for God's new heaven and new earth, praying, "Come, Lord Jesus!"

There is an activeness, an engagement of our hearts, our minds, our spirits to follow the living Christ. It takes courage or maybe craziness to say "come, come in into my life." For we are saying that God still calls us, still uses us, and that we even now seek the living presence of Jesus made real through the Spirit the giver and renewed of life who still...

calls women and men to all ministries of the church. In a broken and fearful world the Spirit gives us courage to pray without ceasing, to witness among all peoples to Christ as Lord and Savior, to unmask idolatries in Church and culture, to hear the voices of peoples long silenced, and to work with others for justice, freedom, and peace.

And since we are people of resurrection we proclaim that not even death will be the end. With believers in every time and place, we rejoice that nothing in life or in death

can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

As a pastor, Easter seems right time to remind myself that since we are an Easter people it should be reflected in practical and maybe uncomfortable ways, such as asking if we have our memorial services, our *Witness to the Resurrection* service planned? For at the time of a death it is a gift to have information from the deceased about their memorial service, the worship plans such as scripture, hymns, and the order of the service as well as the wishes for burial or cremation. So many times I discovered that the words, the scriptures, the plans given in the midst of some of our hardest times come as a comfort, a witness of faith to those that are grieving. Please take time and fill out the attached *Witness to the Resurrection/Funeral Planning Sheet*, share the completed sheet with your family members, your friends, those who are important to you, and send a copy to the church.

May we say "Come, Lord Jesus, into our lives!" And may we follow the One who calls in love.
