

Pentecost, June 8

The Day of Pentecost, which celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the church and closes the fifty days of Eastertide, falls on June 8 this year. The Acts of the Apostles tells us on that first Pentecost, "tongues, as of fire, appeared among them," so wear a touch of red to worship on Pentecost in honor of the gift of the Spirit.

Pentecost Offering, June 8

The annual Pentecost Offering is one of the four special offerings received each year in the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Pentecost Offering helps our youth begin life with a strong start in the years from childhood through young adulthood – a strong start that supports a strong life.

The offering received is divided four ways:

- 40% stays with our congregation to support our own local ministries with children and young people.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Young Adult Volunteer program serving people around the world.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Presbyterian Youth Triennium.
- 10% supports at-risk children by improving education opportunities and safe havens.

Red Cards: Know Your Rights

Old First Presbyterian is investing in "Red Cards," small wallet size cards to share the people who fear ICE coming into their homes and lives. These cards have five simple statements that affirm that all people in the United States, regardless of immigration status, have certain rights and protections under the U.S. Constitution. These cards are created by the Immigrant Legal Resource Center (https://www.ilrc.org) out of an increasingly complex legal and social challenges faced by immigrants, which created a growing need for expert assistance and training in immigration law and policy. You can pick up cards to share with the community in the narthex or by contacting the church office.
