Today's Guest Preacher: Bruce Reyes-Chow

The Reverend Bruce Reyes-Chow preaches for us today. Reyes-Chow is a third generation Filipino/Chinese American and an active speaker, writer, and "coachsultant" on topics of faith, leadership, activism, culture, race, and technology. Ordained in 1995, Bruce was elected moderator of the 218th General Assembly (2008) of the Presbyterian Church (USA) – at that point, the youngest ever to hold the office. Bruce is the author of six books, most recently Everything Good about God Is True: Choosing Faith (Broadleaf, 2024) and In Defense of Kindness: Why It Matters, How It Changes Our Lives, and How It Can Save the World (Chalice, 2022). Bruce and his wife live in San Jose with too many animals and houseplants.

Today's Coffee Hour

Kristi Hoerauf has given today's coffee hour to commemorate the composer George Frideric Handel (1685-1750) and the Foundling Hospital (London, chartered 1739), of which Handel was a benefactor and member of its governing board.

Kristi reports: Annual concerts of Handel's Messiah were held as fundraisers for the Foundling Hospital. In his life-time, £7,000 were raised. That would be over £800,000 today. He also left a complete score of Messiah to the Foundling Hospital in his will, so concerts could continue to be held.

Conversation with Bruce Reyes-Chow after Coffee Hour

Bruce continues to navigate a world that is determined to overwhelm hope. Bruce is also very willing to talk about his pandemic houseplant hangover, his favorite child, Vespa, the English Bull Terrier, and even his rage over the plight of the Oakland Athletics.

Poignantly for many, this year's AIDS/LifeCycle will be the last. Going forward these two institutions will engage in separate fund-raising programs.

The annual Pentecost Offering is one of the four special offerings received each year in the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Pentecost Offering helps our youth begin life with a strong start in the years from childhood through young adulthood – a strong start that supports a strong life.

The offering received is divided four ways:

- 40% stays with our congregation to support our own local ministries with children and young people.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Young Adult Volunteer program serving people around the world.
- 25% supports the PC(USA)'s Presbyterian Youth Triennium.
- 10% supports at-risk children by improving education opportunities and safe havens.
